

## What is an Interstate Compact?

A legal, legislatively enacted contract between two or more states that allows states to:







## Occupational Licensing Interstate Compacts

Facilitate Multistate Practice Maintain or Improve Public Health and Safety

Preserve State
Authority Over
Professional
Licensing



44 states have adopted at least one compact.
28 states have adopted at least three compacts.



Over 200 pieces of compact legislation have been enacted since 2016.



9 professions have active interstate compacts for occupational licensing.

### Compact Development Process

### Phase I Development

#### **TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE GROUP**

- Composed of approx. 20 state officials, stakeholders and issue experts
- Examines issues, current policy, best practices and alternative structures
- Establishes recommendations as to the content of an interstate compact

#### **COMPACT DOCUMENT TEAM**

- Composed of 5 to 8 state officials, stakeholders, and issue experts
- Crafts compact based on recommendations
- Circulates draft compact to states and stakeholder groups for comment

#### FINAL PRODUCT

- Drafting team considers comments and incorporates into compact
- Final product sent to TA group
- · Released to states for consideration

#### Phase II Education and Enactment

#### **EDUCATION**

- Develop comprehensive legislative resource kit
- Develop informational internet site with state-bystate tracking and support documents
- Convene "National Briefing" to educate legislators and key state officials

#### STATE SUPPORT

- Develop network of "champions"
- Provide on-site technical support and assistance
- Provide informational testimony to legislative committees

#### STATE ENACTMENTS

- Track and support state enactments
- Prepare for transition and implementation of compact
- · Provide requested support as needed

### Phase III Transition and Operation

#### **TRANSITION**

- Enactment threshold met
- State notification
- Interim Executive Board appointed
- · Interim Committee's established
- · Convene first Compact meeting
- Information system development (standards, security, vendors)

#### **OPERATION**

- Ongoing state control and governance
- Staff support
- Annual assessment, if necessary
- Annual business meeting
- Information system oversight (maintenance, security, training, etc.)
- Long-term enhancements / up-grades



#### Stakeholder Review

Draft compact circulated for public comment

Standing biweekly virtual meetings to review provisions of the compact

Submit feedback through questionnaire survey

Document Team considers comments and edits the compact as needed

Released to states for consideration and enactment





## Interstate Massage Therapy Compact (IMpact)



#### Multistate Model



LMT wants to practice in other compact member states in addition to

their home state





2) LMT contacts
Massage Therapy
Compact
Commission and
applies for a
multistate license



- Compact Commission Confirms that LMT meets eligibility requirements listed in the compact.
- 4) Commission notifies Home State of LMT's interest in multistate license
- Home State conducts FBI background check and notifies commission of LMTs eligibility.




- 6) LMT Pays multistate license fee
- 7) Commission issues LMT a multistate license acting on behalf of the member states
- 8) LMT receives multistate license and can practice in any compact state with no additional action




#### Multistate Model

LMTis licensed in their home state (who is a member of the compact) and wants to work in any compact member state.



LMT applies to the commission. Commission verifies eligibility Home state conducts background check



LMT can now practice in any other member state via their multistate license.

### Article 3- Member State Requirements



License and regulate massage therapy



Require that licensees satisfy education requirements prior to being licensed in that state



Have a mechanism in place to receive and investigate complaints about licensees practicing in that state



Require that Licensees within the State pass the national licensure examination



## State Requirements to Join Compact (cont.)



Notify the commission of discipline actions taken against a licensee



**Comply with the rules of the Commission** 



Require a background check for licensure



Participate in the Data System and notify Commission and other Member States of any disciplinary action



## Article 4- Multistate License Requirements



Hold an active, unencumbered license in Home State, which must be a member of the compact



Have completed at least 625 clock hours of massage therapy education



Passed the national licensing examination



Pay all required fees related to the application



### Multistate License Requirements

No felony convictions within 5 years

No misdemeanor convictions related to massage therapy within 2 years

No adverse action on a massage therapy license within two years


Have not previously had a massage therapy license revoked or surrendered in-lieu of discipline

No previous convictions related to: kidnapping, human trafficking, human smuggling, sexual battery, or any other category of offense which the Commission by rule may designate



#### Article 6- Adverse Actions

LMT violates practice act in home state.





#### Article 6- Adverse Actions

LMT violates practice act in any remote state



Remote state conducts investigation. Violation is reported by the remote state to commission via the data system.





LMT's home state reviews investigatory information in data system and decides whether to act against the home state license.



Commission, on behalf of the member states, takes adverse action on the LMT's multistate license. LMT no longer able to practice via the multistate license in any compact member state.



## MASSAGE THERAPY LICENSING DATABASE MTLD




Consolidate and integrate key data sources to create a single view of the therapist

#### **MTLD Data Sources**


- Primary Source Data
