







What is an Interstate Compact?



A legal, legislatively enacted contract between two or more states that allows states to:







Occupational Licensing Interstate Compacts



Facilitate Multistate Practice Maintain or Improve Public Health and Safety

Preserve State
Authority Over
Professional
Licensing



48 states and territories have adopted at least one compact.
36 states and territories have adopted at least three compacts.



233 pieces of compact legislation have been enacted since 2016.



12 professions have active interstate compacts for occupational licensing.

Compact Development Process



Phase I Development

TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE GROUP

- Composed of approx. 20 state officials, stakeholders and issue experts
- Examines issues, current policy, best practices and alternative structures
- Establishes recommendations as to the content of an interstate compact

COMPACT DOCUMENT TEAM

- Composed of 5 to 8 state officials, stakeholders, and issue experts
- Crafts compact based on recommendations
- Circulates draft compact to states and stakeholder groups for comment

FINAL PRODUCT

- Drafting team considers comments and incorporates into compact
- Final product sent to TA group
- Released to states for consideration

Phase II Education and Enactment

EDUCATION

- Develop comprehensive legislative resource kit
- Develop informational internet site with state-bystate tracking and support documents
- Convene "National Briefing" to educate legislators and key state officials

STATE SUPPORT

- Develop network of "champions"
- Provide on-site technical support and assistance
- Provide informational testimony to legislative committees

STATE ENACTMENTS

- Track and support state enactments
- Prepare for transition and implementation of compact
- Provide requested support as needed

Phase III Transition and Operation

TRANSITION

- Enactment threshold met
- State notification
- Interim Executive Board appointed
- Interim Committee's established
- Convene first Compact meeting
- Information system development (standards, security, vendors)

OPERATION

- Ongoing state control and governance
- Staff support
- · Annual assessment, if necessary
- Annual business meeting
- Information system oversight (maintenance, security, training, etc.)
- Long-term enhancements / up-grades

Summary of Key Terms




IMpact Defined Term	What does it mean?
Member State	Any state that has enacted the compact
Home State	Licensee's primary state of residence where they hold a license to practice massage therapy
Remote State	A Member State that is not the licensee's Home State
Multistate License	A license granted pursuant to the compact that authorizes practice in all remote states
Authorization to Practice	Authorization granted through an interstate compact license that allows practice within a single remote state.
Compact Commission or Commission	Joint government agency made up of all Participating States who is responsible for administering the compact

Home State License

Authorizes practice in home state only.
Requirement for obtaining a multistate license



LMT holds home state license & multistate license


Authorizes practice in remote states only.

Article 3: Member State Requirements





License and regulate massage therapy



Require that licensees satisfy education requirements prior to being licensed in that state



Have a mechanism in place to receive and investigate complaints about licensees practicing in that state



Accepts passage of a National Licensing Examination as a criterion for Massage Therapy licensure in that State



Article 3: Member State Requirements





Notify the commission of discipline actions taken against a licensee



Comply with the rules of the Commission



Require a background check for licensure



Participate in the Data System and notify Commission and other Member States of any disciplinary action



Article 4: Multistate License Requirements





Hold an active, unencumbered Single State License to practice Massage Therapy in the applicant's Home State;



Have completed at least six hundred and twenty-five (625) clock hours of Massage Therapy education or the substantial equivalent which the Commission may approve by Rule.



Have passed a National Licensing Examination or the substantial equivalent which the Commission may approve by Rule.



Pay all required fees related to the application



Article 4: Multistate License Requirements



No felony convictions within 5 years

No misdemeanor convictions related to massage therapy within 2 years

No adverse action on a massage therapy license within two years

Have not previously had a massage therapy license revoked or surrendered in-lieu of discipline

No previous convictions related to: kidnapping, human trafficking, human smuggling, sexual battery, or any other category of offense which the Commission by rule may designate



Article 6: Adverse Action



LMT violates practice act in home state.



takes adverse action on the single state license.



LMT's multistate license automatically encumbered because a valid, unencumbered single state license is a requirement for the multistate license.

Adverse Action is reported to the remote states via the data system.



Article 6: Adverse Action



The Council of State Governments

LMT violates practice act in a remote state



After final action is taken by Remote State, LMT's home state reviews investigatory information in data system and decides whether to act against the multistate license.





Remote state takes action on "authorization to practice" in their state.

Once Adverse Action occurs, authorization to practice in other remote states is automatically suspended.



Summary of Other Articles





Section 8: Establishment of the Compact Commission

Member states must appoint 1 delegate and the delegate must be the primary administrative officer of the State Licensing Authority or their designee



Section 9: Data System

To function, the compact requires the Commission to develop, maintain and operate a data system containing licensure, Adverse Action and Current Significant Investigative Information on all licensees.



Section 10: Rulemaking

The compact gives the Commission the power to promulgate rules in order to effectively and efficiently implement and administer the purposes and provisions.

Section 11: Oversight, Dispute Resolution and Enforcement



Section 12: Effective Date, Withdrawal and Amendment

The compact shall come into effect and the commission established once the Compact legislation has been enacted by a seventh member state.



The Council of State Governments (CSG) is partnering with the Department of Defense (DoD) and the Federation of State Massage Therapy Boards (FSMTB) to support the mobility of licensed massage therapists through the development of a new interstate compact. This additional licensing pathway will create reciprocity among participant states and reduce the barriers to license portability.





The Interstate Massage Compact has been finalized and is available for enactment.

The following language must be enacted into law by a state to officially join the Interstate Massage Compact.

No substantive changes should be made to the model language. Any substantive changes may jeopardize the enacting state's participation in the Compact.

The Council of State Governments National Center for Interstate Compacts reviews state compact legislation to ensure consistency with the model language.


